Sioux Empire Livestock Show Animal Health Summary

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:

All animals entering the Sioux Empire Livestock Show must be accompanied by a current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI), and shall have official identification listed on the CVI, issued thirty (30) days before the show. Each CVI must:

- Be an official form from the state of origin
- Be issued by an accredited licensed veterinarian
- Show name and address of owner or exhibitor
- Show all required tests and/or vaccinations for import into South Dakota

Please review the species information below for additional information.

Cattle

All entries must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI). One certificate per exhibitor is acceptable; however, do not put two species on the same certificate (ex., heifers, and lambs). An official ID is required to be listed on the health certificate. Out of state animals must have a permit number to enter South Dakota and the Sioux Empire Livestock Show. Call the SD State Veterinarian at 605-773-3321 to obtain a permit number on the CVI.

- Animal(s) must meet tuberculosis and brucellosis qualifications of South Dakota and must be free of any infectious, contagious or communicable disease such as ringworms, warts, pinkeye or lumpy jaw. If warts have been surgically removed, the scars must be healed by the time of exhibition. Before unloading, CVIs must be shown to a livestock attendant in the blue information shack. The original CVI will be collected at check-in.
- Any evidence of warts, ringworm, foot rot, pinkeye, draining abscesses or any other
 contagious diseases will eliminate cattle from the show/sale and from the Expo Building.
 The SELS veterinarian reserves the right to final judgement on ringworm assessment. No
 tolerance on ringworm will be allowed unless the SELS veterinarian determines the
 condition has been treated and is in a noncontagious stage.

Goats

A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required on all animals entering the Sioux Empire Livestock Show. Individual ID must be on the CVI and the herd premise ID number. Goats from out of state need a PERMIT to enter South Dakota and the Sioux Empire Livestock Show. If you are unsure of health requirements for goats entering South Dakota, please have your veterinarian call the South Dakota State Veterinary Office at 605-773-3321 and ask for the PERMIT NUMBER to enter on the CVI. All goats must have individual scrapie ID tag along with herd ID number. Scrapie tag must be listed on health papers.

 Certificate must contain identification as to breed, sex, ear tag number and owner's name and address.

- Goats must be free of scabies, scrapie, and any other symptoms of disease. The CVI MUST STATE goats are free of signs of scabies, scrapie, and fungus.
- CVI must be properly made out and issued within 30 days of the opening of the show.
- Any entry that is not accompanied by a CVI or does not comply with any of these regulations will not be admitted to the Sioux Empire Livestock Show.

Individual ID must match ID on health papers. CVI must be given to show personnel at time of checkin.

Lambs

A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required on all animals entering the Sioux Empire Livestock Show. Individual ID must be on the CVI and the herd premise ID number. Lambs from out of state need a PERMIT to enter South Dakota and the Sioux Empire Livestock Show. If you are unsure of health requirements for lambs entering South Dakota, please have your veterinarian call the South Dakota State Veterinary Office at 605-773-3321 and ask for the PERMIT NUMBER to enter on the CVI. All lambs must have individual scrapie ID tag along with herd ID number. Scrapie tag must be listed in health papers.

- Certificate must contain identification as to breed, sex, ear tag number and owner's name and address.
- Sheep must be free of scabies, scrapie, and any other symptoms of disease. The CVI MUST STATE sheep are free of signs of scabies, scrapie, and fungus.
- CVIs must be properly made out and issued within 30 days of the opening of the show.
- Any entry that is not accompanied by a CVI or does not comply with any of these regulations will not be admitted to the Sioux Empire Livestock Show.
- Individual ID must match ID on health papers. CVI must be given to show personnel at time of check-in.

Swine

A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required on all animals entering the Sioux Empire Livestock Show. Individual ID must be on the CVI and the herd premise ID number. Swine from out of state need a PERMIT to enter South Dakota and the Sioux Empire Livestock Show. If you are unsure of health requirements for swine entering South Dakota, please have your veterinarian call the South Dakota State Veterinary Office at 605-773-3321 and ask for the PERMIT NUMBER to enter on the CVI.

Individual ID must match ID on health papers. CVI must be given to show personnel at time of check-in.


Dogs

DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE EXPO BUILDING during the Sioux Empire Livestock Show. The ADA requires that service animals be under the control of the handler at all times. In most instances, the handler will be the individual with a disability or a third party who accompanies the individual with a disability. The service animal must be harnessed, leashed or tethered while in public places unless these devices interfere with the service animal's work or the person's disability prevents use of these devices.

General Information and Rules

WELCOME: The Sioux Empire Livestock Show staff and volunteers welcome you to Sioux Falls and to the 73rd Sioux Empire Livestock Show. This show would not be possible without dedicated staff, volunteers, and sponsors who honor the longstanding history and the bright future through our mission; **The Sioux Empire Livestock Show promotes and celebrates agriculture through an annual, authentic experience that educates and entertains the community; assists youth exhibitors financially with academic endeavors; and generates economic impact through national livestock consignments and trade show opportunities.**

PARKING: No parking permits required, yet it is recommended that livestock exhibitors park in places designated by the Sioux Empire Livestock Show. Cattle unloading is on the <u>EAST</u> side of the Expo Building. Hogs, Goats, and Sheep unloading is on the <u>NORTH</u> side of the Expo Building, through designated marked doors. DO NOT OPEN OVERHEAD DOORS. Trailer parking is in the south lot, that is south of fairgrounds fence. DO NOT TIE CATTLE TO THE CHAINLINK FENCE.



ELIGIABLE EXHIBTORS: Exhibitors 21 years old and younger **as of Jan. 1, 2026,** are eligible for junior shows (market beef, market hogs, market goats, market lambs, prospect calves, and breeding heifers).

FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.

BARN HOURS: Barn hours are from 5 a.m. – 11 p.m. daily. Absolutely no individuals are allowed in the barn after 11 p.m. each night or before 5 a.m. each morning. In an effort to alleviate disrespect to facility and/or other visitors' personal belongings, a professional security team will be patrolling the interior and exterior of the barn every night/morning. The Sioux Empire Livestock Show is not liable for any theft or damage to exhibitor property.

SHOW BACK NUMBERS: Each animal entered into the Sioux Empire Livestock Show may be assigned a number. Those numbers may be given to each exhibitor as a back number at check-in. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have the correct back number displayed on their back or in a holder attached to exhibitor before entering the ring. If the back number does not correspond with the original entry on the officials' judges' sheet, the result may be a disqualification of that animal.

CODE OF ETHICS: Exhibitors of the Sioux Empire Livestock Show are NOT allowed to artificially fill animals through the use of pumps or bottles. If you are seen doing such an act in the Expo Building, you will be asked to leave the Sioux Empire Livestock Show, with no refunding of entry fees.

Absolutely no unethical oral or injected altering material will be allowed at the Sioux Empire Livestock Show.

FITTING CHUTES: One fitting chute will be allowed per three animals at a cost of \$30 per chute; a second chute is only allowed in with the fourth head at an additional cost of \$30. Upon respective show check-in, chute tags will be available for purchase, issued and must be attached to the fitting chute(s). If the issued tag is not visible on chute, you will be asked to remove your chute from the barn. **You will be assigned a chute area in the barn once you purchase your chute tag.**

GENERATORS: Generators and space heaters are <u>not allowed inside</u> the Expo Building. Exhibitors will need to bring their own 12-gauge, 100-foot to 200-foot extension cords.

PAYING AWARDS: If all necessary documents have been collected from the exhibitor and or buyer, cash awards, livestock sale checks and premiums will be mailed **30 days after the conclusion** of the Sioux Empire Livestock Show.

PROTESTS: All protests must be made on an official protest form obtained by the Sioux Empire Livestock Show office and accompanied by a \$500 cash, cashier's check or money order deposit, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. All protests must plainly state the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Sioux Empire Livestock Show manager immediately after the occasion for protest. Protests will be accepted prior to, and during and six (6) hours immediately following the conclusion of judging. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation; a decision may be withheld util a thorough investigation is completed by the Sioux Empire Livestock Show. No complaint or appeal based solely upon the statement that a judge is incompetent will be considered.

RULES & REGULATIONS:

Exhibitors of the Sioux Empire Livestock Show are NOT allowed to artificially fill animals through the use of pumps or bottles. If you are seen doing such an act in the Expo Building, you will be asked to leave the Sioux Empire Livestock Show, with no refunding of entry fees. Calves may not leave the Expo Building until after the show is complete.

Violation of ethics guidelines or unapproved removal of calves from the Expo Building will result in dismissal from the show, and the exhibitor will <u>forfeit</u> any premiums.

The show staff reserves the right to excuse problem animals from the show ring. *Please do not attempt to show animals that cannot be controlled.*

CHECK-IN: Exhibitors must turn in **completed** declared weight/date of birth card(s) by the end of checkin (1 p.m.)

- Breeding Heifer Calf Show: purebred and commercial heifers born after Jan. 2025.
 - o classes will be divided by declared date of birth (DOB).
- Prospect Calf Show: calves born after Jan. 2025.
 - o classes will be divided by declared weight.
- At check-in, exhibitors will receive a backtag number for each entry, which must be worn by the exhibitor while in the show ring. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make sure they are wearing the correct backtag number assigned to each entry when entering the show ring.

After each class, the top two (or more at the judges/show's discretion) placing entries will be evaluated to ensure identification. If the exhibitor is wearing the incorrect backtag number, or the wrong animal is brought into the ring for judging, they will be disqualified from the show and forfeit any premiums.

Hogs may not leave the Expo Building until after the show is complete.



CHECK-IN: Exhibitors must turn in completed declared weight card(s) by the end of check-in (9 a.m.)

- The Sioux Empire Livestock Show uses a weigh-back system for the Junior Market Hog Show.
- Weight cards will be distributed to exhibitors during check-in. Exhibitors are responsible for turning in <u>completed</u> weight card(s) before check-in closes. This declared weight will become the animal's official weight. Exhibitors are responsible for weighing their own animals. A scale will be provided.
 - o There is a minimum weight of 230lbs and a maximum weight of 320lbs.
 - Purebred hogs can only be entered in **one (1) division**, as designated by the entry form(s) and must be accompanied by a copy of breed registration papers.
- Sioux Empire Livestock Show ear tags will be assigned to each animal. Animals will be ear tagged and the tag must remain in the ear of the animal. If the ear tag is not in the animal at the Sale of Champions or when loaded onto the truck, the exhibitor will <u>forfeit</u> any premiums and market value check.

Exhibitors selling animals must indicate at check-in if they are selling their animal via the market avenue provided by the show. Any animal not making the Sale of Champions and being sold through the avenue provided by the show, the exhibitor must load their animal onto the truck and hand show staff their market loadout slip that will be provided to them at check-in.

The top two (or more, at the judge's or show's discretion) placing animals in each class for all junior market hog classes will be weighed before judge's official placings are taken. No reweighs will be allowed once the animal has stepped off the scale. A variance of 5% from the weight declared will be allowed. All animals outside of the 5% variance will be disqualified and will forfeit any premiums.

Sioux Empire Livestock Show personnel reserve the right to adjust Rules and Regulations as seen fit.

The Sioux Empire Livestock Show uses a weigh-back system for the Junior Market Goat Show.

- Junior market goat classes are open to does and wethers (castrated males).
 - o Entries must be under the age of one year old and have milk/kid teeth in place.
 - Goats whose teeth have been tamped with will be <u>disqualified</u> at the discretion of show officials.
 - o Goats must be broke to lead and must be shown with a halter, collar, or collar with short lead.

RULES & REGULATIONS:

Eligibility: Junior colleges and senior colleges in the U.S. are eligible to enter the Livestock Judging Contest. The entry form, however, must be signed by the official team coach, confirming that all members of the team are eligible to compete in the contest. Colleges can enter as many teams as they desire. To be considered eligible to compete, contestants must have attended full time at the school from which they are competing.

Participation: Each Livestock Judging Team will consist of five (5) eligible members and all team scores will count in the team total. Each team member, along with individual participants/alternates, will be eligible for individual overall awards in their division.

Divisions:

- a. Junior College Freshman Contestants entered in this division must be enrolled in a junior college and cannot compete in this division more than two years.
- **b.** Junior College Sophomore Contestants entered in this division must be enrolled in a junior college and cannot compete in this division more than two years.
- **c.** Senior College Contestants must be enrolled in a senior college.

Classes: Each class will consist of four animals. Animals within a class will be designated by numbers 1, 2, 3 and 4. The following classes will be judged: a total of three to four sheep/goat classes; a total of four to five classes of cattle; and a total of three to four swine classes (any combination of market and/or breeding hogs). Actual class makeup is subject to change within this list of classes.

Time: On each class of livestock, contestants will be allowed twelve (12) minutes to make their observations, record their placings, and take notes. All groups will be notified two (2) minutes before the time is up. All contestants shall hand their cards consisting of their number, class of animals and placings, to the group leader immediately when called for. When final time is called, groups will change to other classes as directed by the superintendent.

Reasons: After placing the classes, the contestants will appear before a judge to give oral reasons defending their placings on certain classes. Each contestant will be allowed two (2) minutes to give reasons on each class. No contestant will be allowed to hold any paper or device of any kind that will assist in stating reasons to the judge. Both divisions will give eight (8) sets of reasons: Four (4) cattle; two (2) swine and two (2) sheep/goat.

Additional information: Uniforms, college colors or any way of signifying to the judge his/her identity or the identity of the college represented is not allowed. While the contest is in progress, no conferring between contestants or anyone else, except as directed by the superintendent or representatives.

Contestants will be disqualified if caught conversing with any other contestant or coach during the contest or oral reasons. No warning will be given. You WILL be disqualified if you are conversing with any other contestant. Any coach or contestant who violates any of the rules of this contest will be barred from competing in future contests and their team will be disqualified for any awards. Use of cell phones or other electronic devices including smartwatches is prohibited.

A. Ties/Scoring: Ties will be broken using species reasons scores, overall reasons scores and overall score when breaking ties within species. Ties within reasons will be broken by overall score and ties within overall score will be broken by overall reasons. Team number and contestant number are assigned at registration. Contestant name, team number, contestant number and placing must be legible on the scorecards, which are provided by the Sioux Empire Livestock Show.
